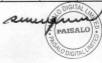

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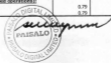

NOTES

1. The above results have been reviewed by Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in their meetings held on April 26, 2024 and audited by the Statutory Auditors of the Company pursuant to applicable provisions of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015. The Statutory Auditors have issued audit report with unmodified conclusion and opinion on financial results.

2. The Consolidated financial results include results of Wholly Owned Subsidiary Nihar Private Limited (a RBI registered Non-Banking Finance Company).

3. The Board of Directors of the Company has recommended the final dividend of 10% (i.e. Rs. 0.10) per fully paid equity share of the face value of Rs. 1.00 each for the year ended March 31, 2024. The Payment of dividend is subject to approval of the shareholders at the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company.

4. The above financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standard prescribed under the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 19, 52 and 63 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015, as amended.
